# MARTHA'S JOURNEY OF BELONGING IN HER CHURCH

On March 29, 2019 Martha received her 1st communion and confirmation in her parish community of St. George's where she has been a member since 1998. Martha is a very sensitive woman who does not speak. In her family, soon after birth, Martha received baptism. And then, as was the custom in those days for many friends who had an intellectual disability, she received no other sacraments.

Martha is a woman of prayer. Elsie is a friend with whom Martha loves to attend concerts at St. Paul's Cathedral, and worship services, and quiet times together at Martha's home, Cana House. Elsie and Martha have been there for each other in joyful moments and in critical times at hospital. Many friends have come to ask Martha to pray when they have carried something heavy or were sick or waiting for medical reports. Martha prays daily in her home and co-leads spiritual retreats with her good friend Anne. Martha is a full member of the CWL group at the church, and she let us know through the interview with the parish minister that she wanted to embrace the next step of confirmation. With her housemate Jennie, friend Elsie, and the team members who supported her, she joined the journey of the parish community with another 25 people, to discern and to prepare for the welcoming of the sacraments.

Affirmed by the knowledge of her gifts — gifts of prayer and presence, the gift of silence, the gift of being with and walking with others, rooted in prayers and confirmed by the community, Martha received the sacraments at St. George's and has already scheduled a retreat to share her gifts. With her friend Anne, she led the retreat "Hold My Hand" on May 11 at the L'Arche Gathering Place. Like Mary, mother of Jesus, Martha is present, she ponders things in her heart, and is very in tune with the movements of the Spirit of Love in the world — Martha is a witness of hope in her community.



# PAUL AND NATALIE, & HEALING THROUGH THE ARTS



Healing through the Arts is a partnership between Participation House, Hutton House, L'Arche London and the London Arts Council. The aim is "to celebrate the resiliency and spirit of people returning home to their communities after years of living in institutions. Through six-week "open studios" the project encourages participants from diverse backgrounds to build meaningful relationships and to celebrate each other's gifts through arts activities that draw on their stories, experiences, stories and ideas." I had the privilege of attending the dance studio with Paul, led by Ruth Douthwright.

The first session was kind of awkward, we didn't really know what to expect, but we embraced the awkwardness together. The community members were friendly, Ruth was an incredible facilitator and I think Paul and I both felt that this was going to a worthwhile experience.

For the first few sessions Paul stayed in his chair, we moved together, around the



other dancers & with them, creating circles, zig-zags and using ribbons, in an attempt to match the rhythm of different songs. Then with the suggestion of Ruth, we ventured from Paul's chair and onto the mats. Anyone who knows Paul knows that mats are his jam. Lying on the floor, he broke into



a belly laugh, so much more comfortable, completely engaged in the music and the movement. I got to watch over the next few weeks as Paul showed us how to move with him with the music on the floor, how Ruth creatively collaborated in Paul's movements with him — adding an exercise ball, a ribbon, or a roll alongside him. It was special to witness the joy Paul found from this experience. It will be a privilege to stand beside Paul as he continues to create and collaborate with Healing through the Arts over their summer session.

Eva Louise Ikerd was born September 11, 2015. She weighed 1 lb 8 oz and was 13.5 inches long. Eva Louise was diagnosed with Wiedemann-Rautenstrauch syndrome (WRS). WRS is a very rare genetic disorder. It is so rare that Eva Louise was only the 35th diagnosed case in the world. She lived 7 ½ months before she went to Heaven. So much was learned about WRS though her life. The doctors documented her journey and she has 2 medical journals written about her.

Eva was a very bright light that shone into the world to reflect the love of Jesus. Brighter than we have ever seen. She was full of determination and spunk. She was quickly known as having the biggest personality of



any baby that anyone had come across. This was incredible for such a tiny baby. Everyone that met her fell instantly in love with her. She was bestowed with the nick name of Houdini due to surprising the doctors by being able to do impossible things. Eva was a complete miracle from the very beginning and through her life's journey. We were told so many times that Eva was so lucky to have us as parents. But we were truly the ones that were so lucky and blessed to have been chosen by God to have our precious Eva. She is a beautiful Child of God and we are so thankful for having Eva Louise Ikerd as our daughter.
